

ACCESSING OUR RESOURCE PROVISION

The Local Authority EHC Team hold the responsibility for allocating and funding the 16 places available in our Resource Provision.

This follows a consultation process in partnership with the School SENDCO and Lead Teacher in charge of the Resource Provision.



All children who receive a designated place in our Resource Provision must hold an EHCP with a diagnosis or working diagnosis of Developmental Language Disorder and/or Speech Sound Disorder or have a hearing loss. SLCN (Speech, Language and Communication Needs) will be identified as the child's primary need. There will also have recommendation from wider professionals, including the Speech and Language Team and/or the Hearing Support Team that a more specialist language provision is required.

Worsbrough Common CIRP is a 16 place Resource Provision for children with significant speech and language needs with a diagnosis or working diagnosis of Developmental Language Disorder and/or Speech Sound Disorder. Some pupils who access this unit may also have a hearing loss. When children join our Resource, they also become a member of Worsbrough Common Primary School, wear the WCPS school uniform, join our school roll and are also allocated a place in a mainstream class.

Whilst accessing our Resource, pupils receive regular Speech and Language support from our in house Speech and Language Therapist and speech and Language Therapy Assistant as well as receiving teaching and learning support from our Lead Teachers in a communication friendly learning environment. Specialist BSL signing is also integrated into our Resource, supporting those with hearing loss.

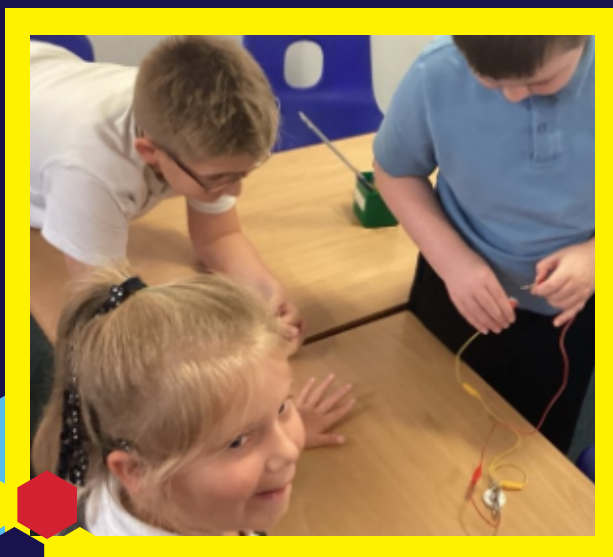
Pupils in our Resource Provision follow our HCAT curriculum which has been carefully crafted to be exciting, challenging and relevant to support pupils develop the skills they require to be independent individuals, ready for life long learning. Children who access our Resource Provision participate fully in school life; this inclusive approach is vital to support our children develop the necessary social communication skills they need to ensure they are prepared for their next stage of education.

Our Resource Provision works closely with parents and carers as well as teachers, support staff and any external professionals working with the child, such as the Hearing Impairment Team, Educational Psychologists, Occupational Therapists and Physiotherapists.

LEAD TEACHER

The Lead Teacher will :

- Ensure pupils develop core literacy and mathematical skills through high quality teaching so that they are able to make good academic progress.
- Implement specialist speech, language and communication strategies and approaches to meet individual needs.
- Liaise and plan with link class teachers so that pupils learning needs are well understood.
- Provide accurate and up-to-date information regarding pupil's academic progress.
- Plan, review and update individual SEN Support plans.
- Provide information and support to parents and carers as well as outside agencies.
- Use speech and language strategies and methods to meet individual needs.



SPEECH & LANGUAGE THERAPY

The Speech and Language Therapist will:

- Carry out detailed assessments of children's strengths and needs linked to Speech and Language.
- Devise and implement individual programmes of work and determine the frequency of intervention.
- Advise on issues relating to Developmental Language Disorder and Speech Sound Disorder
- Provide information and support to parents and carers and school as part of a co-productive approach.

The pupils with Hearing Loss will receive Speech and Language support from the Community Speech and Language Team. Appropriate intervention will be facilitated by BLS trained staff.
