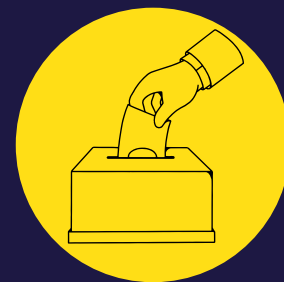
Assemblies

Pupil Leadership

Pupil leadership at WCPS provides pupils with meaningful opportunities to develop confidence, responsibility and the skills needed to enable them to make a positive contribution to their community. Through a range of leadership roles pupils actively engage with our five enrichment areas.

Our leadership opportunities enable children to understand their voice can influence change, reinforce a sense of belonging and active participation.



Pupil Parliament

Consisting of one person representing each of the five enrichment areas. Representatives gather the views of their peers, contribute to decision making and work collaboratively with staff to improve the school experience for all.



Arts and Culture Ambassadors

This role allows children to champion creativity, expression and cultural understanding across school. They help to promote events, celebrations, performances and other opportunities that enrich the experiences of others.



Eco Leaders

This role encourages the school community to care for the environment and develop a strong understanding of sustainability. They lead projects linked to conservation, recycling, biodiversity and outdoor learning.



House Captains, Playground Leaders and Little Leaders

This role provides children an opportunity to lead sporting events in school. Leaders play an important part in ensuring sports and play are inclusive, encouraging younger pupils to engage positively in physical activity. This ensures all children experience the benefits of being active.



Learning Leaders

This role gives children an opportunity to collect pupil voice and share ideas with teachers and school leaders. It provides genuine pupil perspectives on what helps learning and the barriers children face helping schools to make informed decision about curriculum development.
